Mark your calendar for another great time of summer fun at Wonder Valley. We at GRACE Week, are heading to space where we can see where God's power can take us!

Mark your calendars now for **June 12th - June 18th** (Sunday through Saturday).

GRACE Week faculty is made up of people from all walks of life, ages 13 through adulthood. All faculty are volunteers who give of their time, love, and energy!

There will be a training day hosted at Memphis Christian Church on **May 20th from 6-8pm**. This will allow for faculty to obtain necessary training prior to arriving at camp on June 12th. Sunday, June 12th will be used to prepare for the week, learn camper assignments, and get to know each other along with reviewing necessary training topics. Please plan to attend BOTH training days.

To provide for the safety, security and enjoyment of each camper, faculty receive information about schedule, planned activities, campers' disabilities, basic health and safety issues and detailed information about their individual camper on Sunday, June 12th. Campers range in all ages and types of disabilities, and function at different levels. Faculty members are matched with a camper upon previous experience with a person(s) having a disability, years of camp experience, and willingness. Each faculty is assigned an individual camper for each session and is responsible for the care and whereabouts of that camper the entire session. It is also each faculty's responsibility to provide as much or as little assistance to campers so that every camper is able to participate in all activities. Faculty responsibilities *may* include assisting campers with personal care such as dressing, feeding, toileting, bathing, transferring to and from wheelchair, etc.

GRACE Week is open to individuals of all ages with various physical and mental disabilities. GRACE Week provides individuals with disabilities the opportunity to experience Jesus and learn more about His Word in a fun summer camp environment. Campers will participate in daily Bible lessons, memory verses, recreational activities, songs, crafts, fun, and fellowship with old and new camp friends alike.

This year Rocky Railway will be our theme. We are currently in the process of planning lots of cool activities and lessons. If anyone can help with soliciting donations or you would like to help with decoration, lessons, special activities, campfire devotions, or crafts, please let us know.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1) Faculty need to arrive Sunday, June 12th at 2:00 p.m. All Faculty may leave Saturday, June 18th at 5:00 p.m. Faculty children are not permitted to attend the week unless given permission by the dean prior to camp.
- 3) ALL MEDICATION (over-the-counter and prescription) is to be given to the nurse upon arrival. This is for the campers' safety. Camp nurses are responsible for all campers getting their medication when they require it, therefore, faculty are responsible to see a camp nurse to take their own medication as needed.
- 4) All faculty will follow camp schedule unless excused by the dean.
- 5) NO ONE, faculty or campers, is permitted to leave the camp property without permission of the dean.
- 6) The use or possession of alcohol, illegal drugs, or tobacco is strictly prohibited. Visitors are required to refrain from using such while on the camp property. Violation will result in immediate removal from camp property.
- 7) No pets are allowed.
- 8) Cell phones can be used as a camera and alarm clock. Please restrain from using your cell phone for any other purpose. Service is very limited at Wonder Valley and phone calls can be made through the camp office with permission from the dean.
- 9) A Note on Dress: We have agreed to the following standards which we feel keep a modest approach.
FOR GUYS: No speedos or tank top undershirts. Sleeveless shirts should not be low-cut (baring the chest from a side view). Guys wear shirts when traveling to and from swimming areas.
FOR GIRLS: Modest, 1-piece bathing suit. No spaghetti strap or thin-strapped tank-tops. Shirts need to cover the stomach. Fingertip-length shorts.
- 8) Any damage to camp property will be the responsibility of those committing it.
- 10) Respect the property of others. Stay out of other people's belongings. We do not want practical jokes that will hurt and embarrass someone or damage property.
- 11) Faculty's conduct must reflect Biblical standards of purity. Promiscuity and harassment will not be tolerated.
- 12) Visitors: In order to discourage homesickness, and to keep the continuity of the week for the campers, the Directors have made the following guideline:
 - Unregistered campers and parents are discouraged from visiting camp during the week.
 - Any visitors must sign in and be approved by the Dean of that event
 - Mail for campers and faculty is encouraged. Be sure and put their name on the outside of the envelope.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

1. Comfortable clothing and shoes. (Pack a few extras!)
2. Swimsuit, covering, and sunscreen.
3. All personal toiletries: toothpaste, toothbrush, soap, deodorant, hair brush and/or comb, shampoo, razor, shaving cream, etc.
4. Twin bedding and bath: pillow, pillow cover, sheets, blanket, washcloths, and towels.
5. Bible, paper, pen/pencil
6. Flashlight
7. Money for canteen (Sunday & Wednesday Night)
8. Camera & fan (optional)

APPLICATION INFORMATION

- 1) GRACE Week faculty require no previous experience, only a willing heart to serve Christ and show His love.
- 2) Recommended age for GRACE Week Faculty applicants is 13 or older.
- 3) All applications should be filled out and submitted by May^{15th}. The number of accepted campers will be determined at this time based on number of faculty. If you are unable to submit your application by May 15th^t, please notify us by email or phone.
- 4) Anyone submitting an application after May 15thst needs to contact us via e-mail or phone.
- 5) Applications must be filled out completely. This will help place you with appropriate campers and/or specific needed areas.
- 6) All GRACE Week faculty are volunteers and are not paid nor required to pay any fees. Faculty receive a t-shirt at no cost if their registration is submitted prior to the May 15th deadline.
- 7) If you find you are unable to volunteer after you have sent in your application, **please contact the dean** so arrangements can be made for an additional volunteer to fill your place.
- 8) Applicants will be notified of acceptance or if there are further questions.
